Santiago Gil Martinez, Ph.D.
Associate professor in Digital Health,
Department of Health and Nursing Science,
University of Agder, Norway

Santiago Martinez is associate Professor in Digital Health and a member of the E-health Research Centre at the University of Agder, Norway. His research is in interdisciplinary and is focused on the intersection of digital technology (human-centred design), health (evidence-based medicine) and human rights to advance the intersection of the disciplines in tackling global challenges such as universal access to healthcare. His research priorities therefore include global and universal E-health and ethical artificial intelligence (algorithm accountability and ethical AI). He has been working with the University of Oslo the last two years to control and eradicate a neglected tropical disease in South Africa.

Santiago Martinez is a Computer Science Engineer by education, from the University of Seville, Spain. He has a master's in philosophy in Soft. Eng. and Artificial Intelligence from the University of Malaga, Spain. He obtained a PhD in Human-Computer Interaction at Abertay University, Scotland, funded by the Alison Armstrong studentship.

Santiago Gil Martinez is a partner of European research projects on digital inclusion, mobile health, global health (also funded by British AHMRC to Improve healthcare support for rural communities in India, COVID-19 (DIPAR) and Living Labs. In the public sector he collaborates with health institutions such as Hospital Virgen del Rocio (Spain), the Institute for Medical Science and Technology (IMSAT) at the University of Dundee and Dundee Ninewells Hospital (UK); and the South Norway regional hospital (Norway; rural clinics in South Africa and India. In the private sector, he also collaborates with companies from USA, Scotland and Norway.
